ROCKY RIVER ASSISTANCE PACK AND SORT



Due to the COVID-19 public health crisis, the RRAP has cancelled the April monthly Pack & Sort community volunteer night (April 14) and in-person grocery pick-up (April 15) to ensure the health and safety of community volunteers, clients, and students at the Rocky River Adult Activities Center (RRAAC). The RRAAC is also closed indefinitely, limiting access to the RRAP pantry.

In lieu of non-perishable food items in April and May, the RRAP needs monetary donations so they may purchase grocery gift cards to continue assisting our neighbors in need. THE MAY DUGAN CENTER

Your help is needed to ensure that the May Dugan Center can continue to provide critical services during this crisis. May Dugan Center modified its food distribution to make sure that people who need food receive food. We held our first-ever drive-thru food distribution, followed by walk-up by appointment distribution and delivery to seniors and people with disabilities. In a three-day period, we distributed over 20,000 meals and served over 2,400 people. This is a 65% increase in service.

Our center remains available for people struggling with mental health issues, substance use disorders, pregnant teens, and victims of crime. All our programming has adapted to the community need by providing telehealth, and other forms of meaningful contact with clients. We continue to accept new admissions.

We are experiencing growth in the demand for our services!
