Fill us with peace, that we may live as brothers and sisters, harming no one.


O God of the poor,

that we may protect the world and not prey on it, that we may sow beauty, not pollution and destruction.





Planning ahead, we have given all our recipients a supply of non-perishable food to have on-hand in the event that we are forced to suspend our normal operations at some point in the future.



Volunteer Program Update: October 2020

We are thrilled to announce that we will be adding even more shifts to our volunteer schedule for the remainder of the year. We're planning to have the following onsite volunteer schedule available week-to-week for the rest of 2020:

Monday – 9am-12pm, 1-4pm, 5-8pm

Tuesday – 9am-12pm, 1-4pm, 5-8pm

Wednesday – 9am-12pm, 1-4pm, 5-8pm

Thursday – 9am-12pm, 1-4pm, 5-8pm

Friday – 9am-12pm, 1-4pm

Maximum group sizes for each of our onsite shifts may vary, and for the time being our largest cap on volunteer groups will be 25 total volunteers for a given project. The online sign-up should accurately reflect how many volunteers we are still recruiting for a given shift.

In addition to these onsite shifts, we are still recruiting volunteers to assist at our weekly Thursday food distribution events. These shifts will take place at the Muni Lot from 12-5pm each Thursday, and volunteers can

FEAST OF SAINT FRANCIS PROGRAM 2020:

The Healing Power of Love in Action: Creation Care in a Time of Pandemic and Partisanship

The Covenant's 90-minute program enables U.S. Catholics to host in-person or virtual sessions to grow in their understanding and call to care for creation as integral to the Catholic faith through prayer, education and action. It is part of the Season of Creation being marked worldwide with hundreds of events, prayers and activities. The program includes prayers, readings, a short video, discussion questions, and suggested activities. This year, in addition to an in-person group version, we also provide a version for individual/virtual group use.

The 2020 Feast of St. Francis program is framed around St. Francis' famous prayer, the Canticle of Creatures, to illumi-

nate our current journey from the pandemic, from indifference to climate change, from political partisanship, to a place of healing through God, with each other and with Creation. The program ends by offering ways to act, including courageous conversations with friends and family, learning more about our civic duties as Catholics, pledging to vote, and ways to embrace the call to protect life, our vulnerable communities and neighbors, and God's creation which sustains life.






