

HOMELESS STANDDOWN



This 29th version of the **Homeless Stand Down** has some significant changes. The sponsoring organization has once again been folded into another: Hands On is now part of Business Volunteers Unlimited. Due to COVID-19, the 2021 Homeless Stand Down has been restructured to ensure the safety of clients, community partners, and volunteers.

There will not be a large, in-person gathering at Public Auditorium in January. *Instead, we are going to create care packages to be distributed to people experiencing homelessness, on Saturday, Feb. 13th.*

The Cleveland Cares Packages will contain a variety of items including essentials, clothing, nonperishable food, and items that make the clients feel loved. Service organizations like medical, dental, legal, and more will be able to list their services and contact information in our Guidebook.





ACTION ALERTS FROM THE CATHOLIC CONFERENCE OF OHIO:



The Catholic Conference of Ohio is calling upon Governor DeWine to veto SB 175. This recently passed legislation expands the locations at which a person has no duty to retreat before using force in self-defense.

The Conference testified that such a provision is "unnecessary and harmful". It could result in the unnecessary use of force anywhere one has a lawful right to be while also exacerbating racial tensions.

CONTACT GOVERNOR DEWINE and ASK FOR A VETO OF SB 175

SB 175 LESSENS THE "DUTY TO RETREAT" BEFORE USING DEADLY FORCE IN SELF-DEFENSE

"SB 175 expands the locations at which a person has no duty to retreat before using force in self-defense. This provision is unnecessary and harmful. It could result in the unnecessary use of force anywhere one has a lawful right to be. It may also exacerbate racial tensions. Please veto this legislation."
