St. Christopher Parish Pastoral Council Minutes

August 20, 2024

Opening Prayers

The Parish meeting opened with our traditional faith sharing and prayers. The Gospel for the upcoming weekend liturgies for the 21st Sunday of Ordinary Time was read aloud and reflected on by each individual Council member. Personal intercessions were prayed. We concluded Opening Prayer with collective participation in the Responsorial Psalm for the Sunday liturgy.

Welcome and Approval of Minutes

- Bill Blough presided as Vice Chair in the absence of Chris Rosati to whom the collective condolences of Council were extended on the death of his brother. Sarah Rish was welcomed and applauded as a new member of Council. Welcome also was extended to Julie Mallett and Jim Moran, both prospective new Council members.
- Council's meeting minutes for June 18, 2024, were approved and they will be posted on the St. Christopher Parish website.

Ministries Issues and Concerns

Religious Education

- PSR registrations are progressing at a good pace.
- Catechist positions are being finalized. One more catechist may be required.
- "The Way," the junior high school program newly introduced this past school year is drawing higher attendance. Director of Religious Education Sharon Armstrong is sharing with other churches at an upcoming Diocesan meeting the success in which "The Way" has been received by the students and parents at St. Christopher.

Ladies Guild

- A tour of the Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine in Euclid will be open to parishioners and guests on Wednesday, September 11th.
- The Ladies Night Out event will be celebrated Thursday evening, October 10th.
- Ladies Guild book club meetings will resume in September.
- Leadership changes after six years are in the works. The mission is being reviewed.

The Ladies Guild website is being expanded to add a monthly novena – first St. Thérèse of Lisieux – as well as a monthly item on women of interest and access to podcasts and other online resources curated for women of the Parish.

Walking with Purpose – Women's Bible Study

- Pastoral Associate Melissa DiFini is working with Sara Salupo and Tiffany Barker who will organize this upcoming 22-week women's Bible study program at St. Christopher.
- The program will be held from 7:30 to 9 PM on Thursday evenings from October 3rd to May 15th.
- Walking with Purpose aims to help women develop a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. Through personal study and small group discussions, participants will connect everyday challenges with solutions from the teachings of Christ and the Catholic Church.
- Walking with Purpose has elicited positive feedback and complimentary reviews from other parishes.

Walking With Moms in Need

The Ohio March for Life will be held on Friday, October 4th. An 11 o'clock rally will precede the noon march. A bus will depart for Columbus at 8:30 AM. Communications Coordinator Colleen McKenna is producing a promotional flyer for the event.

PATHS [Parents & Teachers Helping Students]

Filling the position of PATHS President for the upcoming school year is edging closer. For now, the executive board is divvying up the responsibilities of the president's role. The first PATHS meeting of the year is Tuesday, September 10th.

Social Concerns

- Christmas in July benefited the Northeast Ohio Coalition for the Homeless. Five carloads of donations were welcomed with gratitude. The organization asked to be considered for next year's Christmas in July appeal too. It was suggested that perhaps the organization could be added to the annual St. Christopher Christmas GIFT program.
- On October 12th, a litter pilgrimage will engage 12 students volunteering service under the leadership of Kate Armstrong.
- A new Outreach Minister at St. Colman Church, Bernice Sanborn, is working in collaboration with Melissa DiFini, to strengthen our Church-in-the-City partnership.
- The St. Colman meal support will be resurrected in conjunction with St. Angela Merici's ongoing commitment to this project. A calendar of meals to be served will be available in November. The goal is for St. Christopher Ministries and families to serve at least three meals annually. Typically, 80 -100 are served. Melissa DiFini, Sharon Armstrong, and Social Concerns Chair Jeanette Nappier have met with the St. Angela team to discuss coordination.

Beginning in September, St. Christopher Parish food donations will be redirected to the St. Colman Church pantry. In addition to food, St. Colman's pantry can use personal care and household cleaning items. Help is needed to deliver donations to St. Colman. Monthly food donations to the Rocky River Assistance Program will be discontinued as RRAP is now fully resourced.

Social Concerns Future

- Cheryl Selak reported that only 3 people attended the Social Concerns August meeting.
- A lively discussion reflected Council members' thoughts after Jeanette Nappier's appeal last month for help in setting direction for the Social Concerns Committee.
- The Committee seems to be taking a new direction toward project leadership versus social concerns.
- Perhaps a rebranding of Social Concerns to something akin to Community
 Outreach might more accurately reflect that this Committee focuses on action –
 not just concern.
- There is concern that the very term "social concerns" carries political overtones.
- Meetings on Tuesday afternoons at 1 PM is a problem. A midday meeting automatically disqualifies a huge portion of parishioners who work or parent fulltime.
- Virtual meeting access (e.g., TEAMS/Zoom) should be offered and encouraged.
- The suggestion was made that the Council formalize our feedback to the Social Concerns Committee and include concrete suggestions to respond to the Committee's request for our input.

J+Walkers Youth Group and Young Adults

- The Youth Group members and leadership spent August focused on participating in the Diocesan softball league, the Parish softball team, and the St. Christopher Parish Weekend. Pastoral Associate Logan Feldkamp and Deacon Mike Hayes provided team and league leadership. Six St. Christopher parishioners played on the Parish team one of 10 teams throughout the Diocese engaging 180 players.
- Weekly Youth Group events will resume in September, offering activities for both high school and middle school students.

Parish Pastoral Council

 - Chris Rosati and Bill Blough will continue to meet with individuals who present themselves as prospects for Parish Pastoral Council service.
 - Prospective members are invited to attend a Council meeting to aid in their discernment process.

- On Thursday, October 17th, Parish Ministries will be invited to meet with newly registered parishioners and showcase their ministries for prospective new members. The Meet & Greet event will be held in the Parish Center from 6:30 to 8:00 PM. Invitations will be sent to those who have registered in the Parish in the past year approximately 100+. Melissa DiFini is coordinating the event.

Father John Updates and Concerns

- Technology The migration of the Parish database from ACS to Realm is being leap-frogged a step to the Ministry Platform. This upgrade will provide calendar functionality which is vital to the church administration.
- Storm report Overall, storm damage was relatively non-disruptive.
 - Power outages in the church, school, and rectory lasted about 5 minutes.
 Mary's Room and the gym were without power for a week. Activities scheduled for the gym had to be relocated. Mary's Room remained accessible with long daylight hours allowing scheduled meetings to proceed.

- The St. Christopher statue in front of the church toppled and was damaged. It will have to be replaced.
- Tree branches and limbs strewn about the property will be dealt with. Buildings were not damaged.
- Church roof drainage problems are causing leaks in the church interior. Interior scaffolding will have to be erected to remedy the damage. For now, affected church pews are partitioned off to prevent potential injury.

Church gifts

- \$1,000 was sent to St. Colman to help replenish the St. Colman pantry.
- St. Colman and Rocky River Assistance Program will remain on the monthly gift envelops that parishioners receive. Additionally, Walking with Moms in Need will be added.

SCP Weekend

- Kevin Tennant provided an update on this coming SCP Weekend. A copy is attached. (Addendum #1)
- Sponsorships are up \$5,000 to \$30,500 including School families.
- Volunteers are still needed, especially for food service.
- AA is providing needed volunteers, especially on Sunday.
- The Parish raffle is the only raffle.
- A pizza vendor has yet to be identified.
- Bob and Annette Crook are managing the food preparation with an eye to offering superior quality at an affordable price. Friday and Saturday night dinners will include homemade pulled pork with an array of side dishes – all for \$15.
- There will be no food tickets. The food will be offered on a pay-as-you-go basis for cash or credit, including Apple Pay.
- Rocky River Brewing will be on hand with a truck with 4 kegs of beer. Canned beer will be provided by a distributor.
- 1 "fun ticket" will be sold for \$1.
- Deacon Mike Hayes will emcee the weekend.
