 - Request from Catholic Climate Covenant to comment on OSHA Heat Rule was presented. It was noted that "workers of color, as with most environmental justice issues, are disproportionately affected" by "working in dangerous heat". Unfortunately, the comment link has stopped working.

Social Concerns Committee Thanksgiving Food Drive 2024

• Establish a committee of 3 or 4 people and delegate the jobs. This year the committee included Mary Ellen Grady, Maggie McIntyre, and Mary Haggard.

• In early October Mary called Cathie Kovacik (440-503-2462). Cathie is the director of Community Corner, 8302 Detroit Road where the food is delivered. It services people living in the St. Colman's and St. Patrick's parish. Mary and Cathie went over the food items that were needed for this year's drive and the date/time for the delivery. Cathie suggested we collect fresh potatoes, sweet potatoes, canned corn, canned cranberries, dinner rolls, fresh pies, brownies and cookies. The delivery was scheduled for the Monday before Thanksgiving at 9:30 a.m.

• Maggie contacted Dawn Bloom, the parish secretary, about putting our food drive announcement in the bulletin. This needs to be done 5 weeks prior to Thanksgiving. Maggie wrote the announcement and requested it be in the bulletin for the 3 weekends prior to Thanksgiving. Following is the information she sent to Dawn: "During the weekend of November 23 and 24 we will be collecting fresh potatoes, sweet potatoes, canned corn, canned cranberries, dinner rolls, fresh pies, brownies, and cookies. These items will be distributed to families in the St. Colman neighborhood for Thanksgiving. Please bring donations to the upper gathering area by11:30 a.m. on November 24. The event is sponsored by the Social Concerns Committee."

• Mary Ellen contacted John Yakim (440-829-9351), the facilities supervisor, in October and requested tables be set up in the upper gathering area the weekend before Thanksgiving.

• A couple weeks before Thanksgiving Jeanette Nappier, the SCC chairperson, sent an email to Gayle Cilimburg requesting inclusion of the Thanksgiving Food Drive in the Mass announcements. Following is the text she sent: "Would you please add the Thanksgiving food collection to the list of suggested Mass announcements for this weekend (November 16-17). The collection, which will benefit families in the St. Colman neighborhood, will take place on the weekend of November 23-24. A list of requested items is in the bulletin." Father John also included the information in his weekly column in the bulletin.

• Six cars were needed to transport the food. Members of the SCC volunteered as well as people from the parish. The drivers this year were: Kevin Becker, Mary Ellen Grady, Mary Ann Jurak, Julie Mallett, Katie and Mary Rose, Kathy and Bob Weist.

• The drivers were asked to donate butter since it needs to be refrigerated and therefore wasn't on the list of foods requested from the parish.

• The drivers met at 9:00 a.m. at church on the Monday before Thanksgiving. It took about 15 minutes to load the cars and another 15 minutes to drive to Community Corner.

• Community Corner is at the corner of West 83rd and Detroit and has a side entrance. The drivers were requested to park on West 83rd. The staff was eager to help and within 10 minutes all the cars were unloaded.

• Before leaving a group picture was taken. It was shared with Colleen McKenna, the parish communication director. She posted an article on Facebook along with the group picture.

• An article and several pictures were also sent to the Belltower Beacon (Lori Alexander Imetro626@gmail.com). Below is the text that was sent.

"Thanks to everyone for your contributions to the Thanksgiving Food Drive. With your help we were able to deliver six carloads of food to Community Corner Hunger Center which services St. Colman's and St. Patrick's Bridge Avenue. The food was distributed to 162 families. They were extremely grateful for the generosity of our parish."

• Jeanette sent a thank you to the priests and Gayle for their help with the food drive. Mary sent a thank you to John, Colleen and Dawn.

• Several days after the food delivery Mary contacted Cathie Kovacik for comments and suggestions for next year. Cathie was very pleased with how things went this year. The Thanksgiving Food Drive provided food for 162 families. Many people commented on how great it was to get butter which is not something that is usually available to them. Her recommendations for next year include providing the same items as this year but to prioritizing pies and rolls and delete the canned corn.

• Possible recommendations for next year. This year many people seemed confused with the two different food drives (SCC and PSR/Day School). It might be helpful for the two drives to be listed together in the bulletin. Perhaps that would help people understand the differences. For example, who is collecting the food, is it fresh or canned food, and where is it delivered.
